ALLEGANY COLLEGE OF MARYLAND

- Scholarship booklet with listings and descriptions of available scholarships is available in high school guidance office.

ALLEGANY COLLEGE OF MARYLAND PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Requirements are:

- High school seniors who plan to enroll full time at Allegany College;
- Minimum 3.0 GPA (Approximately 85%) required;
- Complete Allegany College of Maryland Scholarship online at: www.allegany.edu and search scholarships.

AWARD: \$500

DEADLINE: April 15th

AMERICAN FEDERATION OF STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES (AFSCME) LOCAL 1834

A scholarship program for one senior from Northern Garrett High School and one from Southern Garrett High School.

Requirements are:

- Have a member of the immediate family who belongs to the Local 1834 of AFSCME (father, mother, grandfather, or grandmother);
- Supply a copy of the current union card;
- Have at least a 2.0 GPA;
- Submit a letter of recommendation from a teacher or other school professional;
- Return to scholarship committee at P.O. Box 341, Oakland, MD 21550

AWARD: \$500

DEADLINE: May

AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP – PROCTOR KILDOW POST #71

Designed to recognize one worthy student from SHS for excellence in academics and citizenship.

Requirements are:

- Applicants do not have to be related to a Legion member;
- Selection will be based on academics, citizenship, financial need and letter of recommendation.

AWARD: \$500

DEADLINE: March

ANDREW S. WOODS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships will be awarded to seniors at Southern Garrett High School and Northern Garrett High School in memory of Andrew Woods, sponsored by the WGW Benefit Golf Tournament.

Requirements are:

- Enrollment in a 4-year college or university;
- Has a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA;
- Has been involved in athletics or cheerleading for at least two years during high school;
- Demonstrate financial need;
- Completion of application and two 250-word essays.

AWARD: Two \$2,500 scholarships

DEADLINE: April 10th

ANGIE M. HOUTZ MEMORIAL FUND

Established in memory of Angie Houtz, a naval analyst killed in the September 11, 2001, terrorist attack at the Pentagon. Selection will be based on academic achievements and completion of 200 hours of community service. Requirements are:

- Cumulative, unweighted grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale;
- Attend or be accepted to attend a Maryland public 2 or 4 year college or university;
- Must be a full-time student (minimum 12 credits);
- Must have participated in at least 200 hours of community service;
- Must not be related to any member of the Board of Directors;
- It is not necessary to be a Maryland resident or a United States citizen to apply;

AWARD: \$3,100

AVEREY BRIDGES MEMORIAL SCHOLAR ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Avereay Bridges, a student athlete at Mountain Ridge High School. This \$1,000 Scholarship has been created for Avereay, who was a well-known high school athlete in the area, who excelled in softball and volleyball. Avereay was also a member of the National Honor Society and carried a 4.2 GPA in honors classes. Before her passing Avereay had committed to a full scholarship to play softball for Point Park University in Pittsburgh, PA. Avereay was also known for her compassion and commitment to special needs children and planned on becoming a special needs pediatrician after graduating from college. She touched the lives of many and was known for her broad smile.

Requirements are:

- Lettered in one or more varsity sports in high school;
- Must be of high moral character and show leadership skills;
- Must show involvement in their community in some manner;
- Must have at least a 3.5 GPA taking honors/AP classes (National Honor Society membership desired);
- Must complete a short essay on the importance of compassion for others.

AWARD: \$1,000

DEADLINE: April

AXA ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is sponsored by the AXA Foundation and U.S. News & World Reports. One student from each state will receive a \$10,000 scholarship and ten students selected from across the nation will receive an additional \$15,000.00 each.

Requirements are:

Requirements are:

- Must exhibit leadership through involvement in extra-curricular and/or community activities.

AWARD: \$600

DEADLINE: Return to Counseling Center by April 15th

CATHOLIC DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAS

Two scholarships may be awarded to Garrett County Catholic women.

Requirements are:

- Must have a GPA of 2.5 or higher;
- Provide three references;
- Write a letter describing financial need.

AWARD: Two \$1,000 scholarships

DEADLINE: Must be returned no later than June 30th to address on application

CHRIS LANTZ AMERICAN EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

The Chris Lantz Memorial Fund will award one scholarship to a graduating Southern Garrett High School senior planning to attend a four year college or university.

Requirements are:

- Being a Southern Garrett High School Senior;
- Plan to pursue a bachelor's degree at a four-year university;
- Being a United States citizen;
- Have at least a 3.7 unweighted GPA;
- Must have held leadership positions in school or community organizations;
- Must be involved in community activities;
- Must maintain a physically active lifestyle;

COCA-COLA SCHOLARS PROGRAM

A national merit-based scholarship competition seeking to identify well-rounded, involved individuals with leadership potential.

Requirements are:

- Selection based on character, personal merit, and background of the applicant;
- Special emphasis on demonstrated merit based on student responses in four categories:
- Leadership in school, civic, and other extra-curricular activities;
- Academic achievement and motivation - a minimum 3.0 GPA is required;

DR. KENNETH E. MANN SCHOLARSHIP

The Maryland Association of Elementary School Principals offers a scholarship to a Maryland high school senior who plans to pursue a career in elementary teacher education.

Requirements are:

- Complete an application;
- Provide transcripts, including test scores;
- Demonstrate the need for financial assistance;
- Submit a letter of interest, outlining qualifications;
- Provide a written statement as to personal beliefs and commitment toward educating all students. The successful applicant must be a second semester senior in Maryland who has the recommendations of a school teacher and a person outside of the school;
- Demonstrate scholastic achievement in their senior year. For example: A/B student honor roll student, National Honor Society, volunteer work in their local school/community service toward education, etc.
- Agree to complete their degree in elementary teacher education in the State of Maryland;
- Submit letters of recommendation;
- Applications are available in school counselor office.

AWARD: \$1,000

DEADLINE: February

DWIGHT P. JACOBUS

The Association of School Business Officials of Maryland and the District of Columbia awards up to six scholarships to undergraduate students pursuing a career in business or education at an accredited institution of higher education within Maryland or the District of Columbia.

Requirements are:

- Being a resident of Maryland or the District of Columbia;
- Being accepted as full time student at an accredited post-secondary school;
- Have demonstrated financial need;

- Plan to enroll in a vocational or technical program of study lasting not longer than two years.

AWARD: \$1,000 renewable for one year

DEADLINE: Postmarked by March 31st

FRANCIS & OLIVE SPOERLEIN SCHOLARSHIP

Requirements include:

- Must be a senior at Northern High School;
- Scholarships will be a one-time award of \$1,000;
- Award will be given to one male and one female student;
- Applicant must indicate intention of entering an accredited 2-year college, 4-year college, professional, or technical school in the Fall semester of the year in which the award is given
- Letter of acceptance from educational institute is required;
- At least one letter of recommendation must be submitted with the application from a teacher, community member, coach, etc.;
- Financial need is considered;
- Applicant must include a transcript with application;
- Short essay including financial need, why you are deserving of this award, post-secondary plans, career goals, extracurricular activities, and community involvement.

FRANK H. EBERLY JR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Frank H. Eberly Memorial Scholarship is available to graduating high school seniors who are enrolled in public or private schools in Garrett and Allegany Counties in MD. Two \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded.

Criteria include:

- A cover letter of no more than 250 words describing who you are as a person;
- A single-page resume with references that covers academic achievement, work experience, and volunteer activities;
- A certified high school transcript;
- A list of colleges or universities that you are considering at this time along with a copy of any acceptance letters that you have received to date.

AWARD: \$1,000

DEADLINE: March

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

This is the form that is required by most colleges and post-secondary schools in order to determine eligibility for federal and state financial aid programs, including the Pell Grant and the Guaranteed Access Grant. Complete and submit electronically ASAP after October 1 - no later than March 1 for Maryland state scholarships.

FFA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Provides scholarships to students who enroll in a two-year or four-year college. Booklet listing various scholarships must be reviewed in the guidance office.

Requirements are:

- Available to FFA members in their senior of high school;
- FFA members who are high school graduates preparing to enroll in their first year of education beyond high school;
- FFA members who are currently enrolled in college. Application is on the website at: ffa.org (under "Participate" link) or by calling the FFA Headquarters at 1-800-772-0939;
- Look for scholarship link under the "Participate" tab on website.

AWARD: \$550 to \$10,000

GARRETT COMMUNITY CONCERT BAND SCHOLARSHIP

The Garrett Community Concert Band will award up to \$500 to a high school senior or older student.

Requirements are:

- Plan to attend an accredited college/university;
- Plan to continue participation in instrumental music or to pursue a degree in music (pursuit of a degree in music is not required);
- Auditions are not required.

DEADLINE: No later June 15th (*none accepted after this date*)

GARRETT COUNTY/MARYLAND FARM BUREAU SCHOLARSHIPS

The Maryland Farm Bureau will offer five \$2,000 scholarships. The Garrett County Farm Bureau will offer four scholarships.

Requirements are:

- Must be high school seniors starting college in the fall after graduation or be full-time students at any community college or four-year institution;
- Applicants or their parent/guardians must be members of the Maryland Farm Bureau;
- Application requires a two-page essay;
- Fill out one application and one essay at the website below to be eligible for both scholarships. In order to be considered for Garrett County scholarship you must also complete activities form;
- Application is available at garrett.mdfarmbureau.com

AWARD: Nine Scholarships, amount varies

DEADLINE: Must be received by 4pm on February 1st

GARRETT COUNTY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Designed to encourage Garrett County high school graduates to pursue post-secondary educational opportunities at Garrett College.

Requirements are:

- Open to members of the graduating classes of NGHS and SGHS;
- Must be a legally documented resident of Garrett County for a period of two full years prior to September 1 of the effective date of GCSP enrollment;
- Must complete GCSP application form, Garrett College admissions application, FAFSA form and application forms for Maryland financial aid programs, including the Guaranteed Access Grant;
- Application available at www.garrettcollege.edu and in school counselor's office.

AWARD: Amount covers the costs of tuition and combined fees at Garrett College

DEADLINE: May 1st

GARRETT REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER AND MEDICAL STAFF SCHOLARSHIPS

Established to provide financial assistance to graduating seniors from Northern Garrett High School and Southern Garrett High School who are planning to pursue a degree in a health-related field. Requirements are:

- Have at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA;
- Plan to pursue a health-related major at a two-year or four-year college or university;
- Demonstrate character, leadership, and financial need;
- Involvement in extra-curricular and/or community activities;
- Two recommendations;
- 500-word essay;
- Preference will be given to students enrolled in one of the following high school pathways: Medical Technology, Nursing, or Professional Medical Services.

AWARD: \$500

DEADLINE: April 15th

GARRETT COUNTY EDUCATION ASSOCIATION

Established to provide financial assistance for aspiring teachers in Garrett County.

Requirements are:

- Must be planning to major in teacher education at an accredited college/university;
- Based on application, including personal essay and letters of recommendation.

AWARD: Two \$250 scholarships

DEADLINE: Submitted to GCEA Office by April 15th

GARRETT SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT SCHOLARSHIP

Requirements are:

- GPA 3.0 or better;
- Major in agriculture or natural resources related field;
- Garrett County resident;
- Must enroll full time at college.

AWARD: Two \$1,000 scholarships

DEADLINE: Return by May 1st

GEORGE B. AND LENORE MORGAN HUMBERSON SCHOLARSHIP

Designed to provide financial assistance to a graduating senior at Northern Garrett High School who plans to attend Frostburg State University.

Requirements are:

- Planning to attend Frostburg State University;
- Submit an applicant written essay describing his/her career goals, school and community involvement, financial need and why he/she is deserving of this award.

AWARD: \$1,000

DEADLINE: April 8th

GLENN R. MUNCH SCHOLARSHIP

The Maryland Association of Pupil Personnel will award at least one scholarship to a high school senior in Maryland who has overcome adversity and made the readjustments necessary to succeed in high school and in life.

Requirements are:

- Eligible candidates must plan to attend post-secondary school;
- Application requires an essay on the topic "My Gift of Service";
- Two reference letters;
- Check with School Counselor for application.

DEADLINE: March 11th

GRAM'S PROMISE CHARITABLE FOUNDATION

Elizabeth Ann "Libby" First Memorial Scholarship. Established to recognize Maryland high school seniors for their activism and leadership among their peers in the fight against tobacco use. Seniors who are tobacco-free and have demonstrated a commitment to anti-smoking advocacy are encouraged to apply.

AWARD: \$250

DEADLINE: April 22nd

GRANTSVILLE LIONS CLUB

Established to help defray costs of tuition, books and living expenses for eligible seniors at Northern Garrett Senior High School planning for post-secondary education.

Requirements are:

- Must be planning to attend any accredited two-year or four-year college, business, professional or technical school in fall;
- Must rank in top 50% of graduating class;
- Must be able to prove definite financial need;
- Must be specific in answering application questions with typed or neatly printed responses;
- Must complete Family Financial Analysis page OR submit statement from financial aid office of college you plan on attending, stating you qualify for financial need.

AWARD: \$500 (4 awarded)

DEADLINE: March 15th

GRANTSVILLE ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Established for graduating Garrett County seniors to provide financial assistance for post-secondary education. The main focus of this scholarship is on students who have demonstrated merit in community and volunteer service.

Requirements are:

- Being a senior at Northern Garrett High School or Southern Garrett High School;
- Plan to attend a post-secondary institution as a full-time student (includes colleges, trade, technical schools, etc.);
- Demonstrate merit in community service and/or volunteer activities during high school;
- Have and maintain a cumulative GPA of "C" or higher;
- NOTE: Immediate family members and/or dependents of the Grantsville Rotary are not eligible.

HARRISON FOY MEMORIAL/NORTHERN HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP

The Harrison Foy Memorial Scholarship is offered to students from Northern High School who participated in at least one varsity sport their senior year. A committee consisting of school administrators and the Athletic Director will select the scholarship recipient.

Requirements are:

- Being accepted to an accredited two or four-year College, professional, or technical school;
- A copy of the acceptance letter must accompany the scholarship application;
- Provide a letter of recommendation from a school or county official;
- Complete the Harrison Foy Memorial Scholarship Application;
- Include a max. 300 word essay describing what you have gained by participating in athletics during your High School career.

HICKORY ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION CENTER COORDINATORS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a senior pursuing a degree in Engineering with special consideration given to Aerospace, Astrophysics, etc.

Requirements are:

- Must be a senior at Northern or Southern High School;
- Supply a copy of high school transcript;
- Proof of acceptance into an accredited secondary institution;
- Pursuing a degree in Engineering with special consideration given to Aerospace, Astrophysics, etc.
- Provide a letter of recommendation from a school or county official;
- Application will be available in school counselor's office.

HICKORY ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION CENTER PLANETARIUM SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a senior pursuing a degree in Environmental Science of Wildlife Management.

Requirements are:

- Must be a senior at Northern or Southern High School;
- Supply a copy of their transcript;
- Proof of acceptance into an accredited secondary institution;
- Pursuing a degree in Environmental Science of Wildlife Management;
- Provide a letter of recommendation from a school or county official;
- Application will be available in school counselor's office.

HORATIO ALGER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

Seeks to provide financial assistance to students who have demonstrated integrity, perseverance in overcoming adversity, financial need, strength of character, commitment to pursue a college education and a desire to contribute to society.

Requirement are:
