## ANDREW S. WOODS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarships will be awarded to seniors at Southern Garrett High School and Northern Garrett High School in memory of Andrew Woods, sponsored by the WGW Benefit Golf Tournament.

- Enrollment in a 4-year college or university;
- Has a minimum 3.0 cumulative gpa;
- Has been involved in athletics or cheerleading for at least two years during high school;
- Demonstrate financial need;
- Completion of application and two 250-word essays.

- Must not be related to any member of the Board of Directors.
- It is not necessary to be a Maryland resident or a United States citizen to apply.
- All application materials must be postmarked by April 30

### **AVEREY BRIDGES MEMORIAL SCHOLAR ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP**

### **CITE SCHOLARSHIP**

Scholarships will be awarded to Black, African-American students in the amount of \$2,000 per year for four years.

Eligible applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a Black, African-American United States citizen
- Be a high school senior
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Be accepted at an accredited college/university, and provide proof of enrollment
- Must be recommended by their local CITE Affiliate (Consortium of Information and Telecommunications Executives - Verizon Corporation)

### **COCA-COLA SCHOLARS PROGRAM**

A national merit-based scholarship competition seeking to identify well-rounded, involved individuals with leadership potential.

- Must be high school senior planning to attend an accredited college or university
- Selection based on **character, personal merit, and background** of the applicant
- Special emphasis on **demonstrated merit** based on student responses in four categories:
  - **leadership** in school, civic, and other extra-curricular activities
  - **academic achievement and motivation** - a minimum 3.0 GPA (approximately 85%) is required
  - **community service and volunteer activities**
  - **employment during and/or after the school year**

- Must be a resident of Garrett County and receive a high school diploma from a program approved by the State of Maryland
- Must be planning to enroll as a full-time student or be enrolled in the Lead Maryland Program

### **GARRETT COUNTY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

Designed to encourage Garrett County high school graduates to pursue post-secondary educational opportunities at Garrett College.

- Open to members of the graduating classes of NGHS and SGHS
- Must be a legally documented resident of Garrett County for a period of two full years prior to September 1 of the effective date of GCSP enrollment
- Must complete GCSP application form, Garrett College admissions application, FAFSA form and application forms for Maryland financial aid programs, including the Guaranteed Access Grant
- Award amount covers the costs of tuition and combined fees at Garrett College for up to 64 credit hours of study in the student's chosen program of student

### **GARRETT REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER AND MEDICAL STAFF SCHOLARSHIPS**

Established to provide financial assistance to graduating seniors from Northern Garrett High School and from Southern Garrett High School who are planning to pursue a degree in a health-related field.

### **GRAM’S PROMISE CHARITABLE FOUNDATION** - Elizabeth Ann “Libby” First Memorial Scholarship.

Established to recognize Maryland high school seniors for their activism and leadership among their peers in the fight against tobacco use. Seniors who are tobacco-free and have demonstrated a commitment to anti-smoking advocacy are encouraged to apply.

**AWARD:** *Minimum \$250.00*

**DEADLINE:** *April*

### **GRANTSVILLE LIONS CLUB**

Established to help defray costs of tuition, books and living expenses for eligible seniors at Northern Garrett Senior High School planning for post-secondary education.

- Must be planning to attend any accredited two-year or four-year college, business, professional or technical school in fall
- Must rank in top 50% of graduating class
- Must be able to prove definite financial need
- Must be specific in answering application questions with typed or neatly printed responses
- Must complete Family Financial Analysis page OR submit statement from financial aid office of college you plan on attending, stating you qualify for financial need

### **GRANTSVILLE ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP**

Established for graduating seniors (from Garrett County) to provide financial assistance for post secondary education. The main focus of this scholarship is on students who have demonstrated merit in community and volunteer service. Applicants must:

- Be a senior at Northern High School or Southern High School
- Plan to attend a postsecondary institution as a full-time student (includes colleges, trade, technical schools, etc.)
- Demonstrate merit in community service and/or volunteer activities during high school (grades 9-12)
- Have and maintain a cumulative GPA of “C” or higher
- NOTE: Immediate family members and/or dependents of the Grantsville Rotary are not eligible.

### **GREATER GRANTSVILLE BUSINESS ASSOCIATION (GGBA)**

- Must be entering an accredited 2 or 4 year college, vocational, business or technical school
- Must have a GPA of 2.5 or higher
- List areas of interest, group activities and community service
- Provide 2 letters of recommendation
- Brief essay describing in applicant's own words why you are applying for this scholarship, your career goals and business aspirations (500 words)
- Recipient to give a brief presentation at a GGBA meeting
- To be used for books and supplies

### **HARRISON FOY MEMORIAL/NORTHERN HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP**

The Harrison Foy Memorial Scholarship is offered to students from Northern High School who participated in at least one varsity sport their senior year. A committee consisting of school administrators and the Athletic Director will select the scholarship recipient.

- Be accepted to an accredited two or four-year college, professional, or technical school. A copy of the acceptance letter must accompany the scholarship application;
- provide a letter of recommendation from a school or county official;
- complete the Harrison Foy Memorial Scholarship Application;
- Include a max. 300 word essay describing what you have gained by participating in athletics during your High School career

### **HICKORY ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION CENTER COORDINATORS SCHOLARSHIP**

This scholarship is awarded to a senior pursuing a degree in Engineering with special consideration given to Aerospace, Astrophysics, etc. A letter of recommendation from a school or county official must accompany their application.

- Must be a senior at Northern or Southern High School
- Supply a copy of their transcript
- Proof of acceptance into an accredited secondary institution
- Pursuing a degree in Environmental Science or Wildlife Management
- Provide a letter of recommendation from a school or county official

Application will be available in the counseling center.
